FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK . . .

Sacred Space



Recently I have been a part of several conversations amongst other clergy where "sacred space" was discussed. Some of these conversations were specifically in regards to worship experiences and the other was literally about finding a geographic/physical location that was sacred to those of us participating in the conversation.

Many of us consider sacred space (especially for worship) to be the church sanctuary. The place most of us have gone to all of our lives on Sunday mornings to pray, sing, hear the Word of God proclaimed, and to fellowship with our sisters and brothers in Christ. I personally also find "sacred space" when I walk along a flowing stream or sit beside a waterfall. Different things connect us in different ways to the time and place we find sacred.

And yet this year, "sacred space" has been transformed for so many people throughout the world. For several months, the only option we had for "sacred space" was our living rooms or offices as we "zoomed" church. In June, the parking lot at New Beginnings became "sacred space" for some of us. And how wondrous it has been to worship outside under the sun in the beauty of God's creation. Some people have returned to the "traditional sacred space" of the sanctuary at Vandergrift when we moved back into the building in July.

If you are either unable or unwilling to return to worship in person (whether it be inside or outside) and choose to join us virtually, I would urge you to create a "sacred space" (if you have not already done so) in whatever place you use to be a part of the worship time we offer. Light a candle, have your Bible and your hymnal (if you have one) with you so you can turn to it at the appropriate time in the service, hang a cross upon the wall or stand it up on the table, or have a plant or flower arrangement in honor of God's beautiful creation in the space. All these items can add to the atmosphere of your worship experience.

And if you are joining us virtually, I would encourage you not to just "watch" worship but participate fully each Sunday. Our world continues to evolve and change and I urge each of you to continue to be patient and faithful in your support and participation in the life of the church.





COVID 19 & Church Finances

First, I would like to thank all the members and friends of the Kiski Charge (New Beginnings and First UMC, Vandergrift) for their continued prayers, presence, and financial support. As we have heard it said many times this year: we are living in unprecedented times. Who would have ever imagined our church buildings being closed for months at a time? And while the building may have been closed, the church itself was alive and well.

We have adapted worship, Bible study, Messy Church, book study, and meetings to virtual formats and/or outside events. We have all been operating on a huge learning curve. Thank you for your patience, your encouragement, and your diligence in stepping forward when needed.



Some of you have inquired about the church finances especially considering that what we know as church attendance has changed as well as giving patterns. But through your faithfulness and some "outside" help, we are holding our own through the pandemic.

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act was signed into law on March 27, 2020. It is the third relief package enacted by Congress in response to the COVID-19 outbreak, and the most extensive of the three pieces, providing \$2.2 trillion in relief funds to state governments, business, non-profits and individuals.

Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP"): This piece of the CARES Act provides a safety net for small businesses with less than 500 employees, creating an incentive to keep those employees working. It will effectively work like a federal grant program, such that the Employer (churches in our case) will NOT ever have to repay the loans, so long as the funds are fully utilized to pay qualified payroll and non-payroll expenses.

Key provisions of the Paycheck Protection Program: Covers payroll costs, healthcare premiums and benefits, employee salaries, mortgage interest (but not prepayments or principal payments), rent payments, utilities and other interest payments; Covers up to 24 weeks for these qualified expenses; and pays the Employer the lesser of 2.5 times the average monthly payroll or \$10 million.

Both New Beginnings and First UMC applied for and were approved for the PPP program. New Beginnings was awarded a larger amount because that church is the paying agent for the pastor's salary. That was a benefit to both churches. All the money awarded to both churches has been fully used according to the guidelines established by the federal government. Soon, we will be applying for the forgiveness portion of the program.

I would encourage you to continue to be faithful in your financial support to the church. I am so pleased to report that giving at both churches is ahead of where we were last year at this time (in spite of the pandemic). Way to go! THANK YOU! If you are unable to join us for in-person worship and instead worship virtually, please remember to send in your gifts.

As you know, we are not through this yet. We continue to adapt and look for new and unexpected ways to continue in mission and ministry. Please watch for email, Facebook, and snail mail updates as we move forward.
